Dear Mr. Runstadler:

The Waste Management Bureau's Waste Engineering & Enforcement Division (WEED) has received your correspondence (letter dated June 16, 1992) regarding the on-site use of contaminated soil generated during construction activities at the Textron Lycoming/Stratford Army Engine Plant.

The material described in your most recent correspondence is not considered "clean fill" under the Solid Waste Management Regulations. As such, this office cannot authorize the use of this material in the manner described. However, it appears that we could authorize the disposal at a permitted solid waste disposal area. Textron Lycoming presented a very similar proposal to this office in 1990. Attached is a response letter dated October 26, 1990, outlining the steps necessary for this office to write a disposal authorization for this material.

The potential for utilization of this material on-site should be discussed with the Water Management Bureau's Engineering & Enforcement Division/Groundwater Section (566-3654).
