Re: UST Files for USTs at the Stratford Army Engine Plant


Dear Ms. Cheng:

Based upon your discussion of February 11, 1997 with Keith Knauerhase, it is AlliedSignal's understanding the CT DEP's UST files indicate that all but two of the USTs (two 3,000 gallon gasoline USTs installed in March, 1990) formerly listed as present at the Stratford Army Engine Plant (SAEP) at 550 Main Street in Stratford, Connecticut, have either been removed or abandoned in place. It should be noted that this includes those tanks located at the Stratford Airport, Sikorsky Hangers (across Main Street from the SAEP) that were formerly under the control of (but never owned by) Textron Flight Services a division of Textron Lycoming (Textron), the former owner of the facility. Textron closed or removed these USTs prior to the purchase of the SAEP by AlliedSignal from Textron. AlliedSignal is not now, or ever has been, associated with these USTs.

After a review of files retained at the SAEP's environmental department, copies of the "Underground Storage Facility Notification" (USFN) form and the closure report sent to the CT DEP on March 1, 1996 were located. Copies of this information are included with this letter. For your convenience new copies of the USFN for the two USTs described above are also included. Based upon your conversation with Mr. Knauerhase, this should complete the CT DEP files concerning USTs at the SAEP.
