Re: Use of Non-Hazardous Contaminated Soil

Dear Mr. McKeegan:

We have an estimated 16,000 cubic yards of soil contaminated with low levels of total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH) from site remediation at Building #65. The DEP Hazardous Waste Section has concurred with our determination that this material is not hazardous.

Attached are copies of soil analyses and a sieve test on the soil. Our concern at this time is disposal of the soil containing only TPH - with no detectable VOC's and no RCRA hazardous materials.

We understand from discussions our own personnel and our consultants have had with you that use of this oil-contaminated material on our own site is within the jurisdiction of your branch of the DEP, however, disposal off site in state does require your approval. We further understand that you are working in concert with others in assuring that other branches of the DEP, as appropriate, also concur.

Would you please provide us with a determination of off-site uses for such fraction of this soil which is in excess of the quantity we are able to use by our preferred option of using as much on site as possible.
