## SUBJECT: RESPONSE TO REGULATORY AGENCY COMMENTS DRAFT RI WORK PLAN ADDITIONAL GROUNDWATER INVESTIGATIONS STRATFORD ARMY ENGINE PLANT

Dear Mr. Feathers,

Enclosed please find the response to regulatory agency comments on the Draft Remedial Investigation Work Plan (October 12, 2001) for the Stratford Army Engine Plant (SAEP). The enclosed document was prepared by Harding ESE, Inc., a MACTEC Company, under contract to the Chemical, Biological Defense Command, Contract Number DAAAM-02-97-D-0005.

The following investigations proposed in the Draft Work Plan have been completed as of the end of December 2001:

- Installed and developed 3 monitoring wells to further delineate the extent of deep VOC groundwater contamination, and
- Installed and developed 8 new monitoring wells to collect data in support of a VOC MNA remedial alternative.

As you discussed in a December 17, 2001 telephone call with Rod Pendleton of Harding ESE, groundwater profiling using a GeoProbe was conducted in place of the proposed monitoring wells HESE-01-11I and -11D.

The U.S. Army is currently considering additional investigations relative to your comments dated November 21, 2001 on the Draft Remedial Investigation Report (URSGWC, 2000); therefore field investigations are being temporarily suspended until the scope of potential additional investigations is resolved.
